



How to “Fix” a Provisional In-Person Ballot

Take the following steps as soon as possible before 5pm on Friday, November 6 to make sure your provisional in-person ballot counts if you voted a provisional in-person ballot for either of these reasons:

1. You did not have proper ID with you when you voted, or
2. You are a first-time voter and need to provide proof-of-address

Step 1: Locate one of the following forms of ID

If you did not have proper ID with you at the polls:

- Georgia Driver’s License (can be expired)
- Current out-of-state Driver’s License (cannot be expired)
- Valid Photo ID card issued by an entity of the state of Georgia, any other state, or the U.S.
- Valid U.S. Passport
- Valid government employee photo ID
- Valid U.S. military ID card with photo
- Student photo ID card issued by a Georgia public college, university, or technical school
- Valid Tribal ID with photo

If you are a first-time voters who need to provide proof-of-address ID:

- Current utility bill showing name and address
- Current government check or paycheck showing name and address
- Current government document showing name and address
- Current bank statement showing name and address

Step 2: Submit the ID to your county registrar

The ID can be delivered personally by the voter or a third person, or you can send a copy (can be photographs of your ID) by mail, email, or fax to your county. Find the [contact information for your county here](#) - and make your vote count today!
